R-20-03**

**AMENDED STANDING PUBLIC HEALTH ORDER
CLOSING COUNTY ROADS TO NON-COUNTY RESIDENTS**

May 14, 2020

1. **Purpose, Effective Area.** This Public Health Order is being issued to limit the health impacts of COVID-19. This Order sets forth requirements to slow the spread of the COVID-19 virus. This Order is effective within the entirety of Clear Creek County, including all towns within the County. This Order amends the Standing Public Health Order adopted in Resolution R-20-02 on April 9, 2020.
2. **Effective Date and Time, Limitations.** The Public Health Order will become effective at 12:01 a.m. on May 16, 2020, unless otherwise specifically provided for herein, and will remain in effect until further notice.
3. **Purpose and Area Subject to Order.** This Amended Public Health Order No. 20-1 ("Order") is being issued to limit the health impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic including without limitation preventing the spread of the COVID-19 virus in Clear Creek County and protecting the health, safety and welfare of Clear Creek County residents, Clear Creek County public safety responders, and the public generally. This Order applies to the entirety of Clear Creek County. A map and road list showing the Clear Creek County roads affected by this order is attached as Appendix 1.
4. **Background.** On January 30, 2020, the World Health Organization ("WHO") declared the worldwide outbreak of COVID-19 a "public health emergency of international concern." On January 31, 2020, the United States Department of Health and Human Services declared the virus a public health emergency.

On March 10, 2020, the Governor of Colorado (the "Governor") declared a state of Emergency related to the presence of COVID-19 in the State. The Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment ("CDPHE") has confirmed that COVID-19 continues to spread throughout the State of Colorado.

On March 11, 2020, WHO declared COVID-19 a pandemic, pointing to the sustained risk of further global spread.

On March 16, 2020, Chaffee County ("County") declared a Local Disaster Emergency related to COVID-19. Pursuant to Resolution 20-26, the County ratified and extended this Local Disaster Emergency declaration at a meeting of the Clear Creek County Board of County Commissioners ("BoCC") on March 17, 2020. The BoCC further extended the disaster declaration on April 14, 2020 (Resolution 20-42) and May 12, 2020 (Resolution 20-48).

On March 13, 2020, the President of the United States (the "President") declared a National Emergency due to COVID-19.



On March 19, 2020, CDPHE issued Public Order 20-23, which implemented additional social distancing measures, such as: limiting all mass gathering (including community, civic, public, leisure, faith-based events, sporting events with spectators, concerts, conventions, fundraisers, parades, fairs, festivals, and any similar event or activity) to no more than ten people. Public Order 20-23 made exemptions for governmental agencies, transportation stations, health care facilities, grocer/retail stores, pharmacies, government buildings and factories.

On March 25, 2020, the Governor issued Executive Order 2020-17, ordering Coloradans to stay at home due to the presence of COVID-19 in the State of Colorado, with certain directives and directed CDPHE to issue a public health order consistent with the directives of Executive Order 2020-17.

On March 25, 2020, CDPHE issued Public Order 20-24, which implemented stay at home requirements, including but not limited to ordering: people to Stay at Home whenever possible, limiting all public and private gatherings occurring outside regardless of the size, limiting travel, and closing all businesses except Critical Businesses.

On April 6, 2020, The Governor Amended Executive Order 2020-17. The Amended Executive Order extended the requirements for Coloradans to stay at home to April 26, 2020, clarifying what activities Coloradans are allowed to engage in and emphasizing that local public health authorities have the authority to issue a more protective public health order than the Governor's Executive Orders.

On April 26, 2020, the Governor issued Executive Order 2020-044 which implemented a Safer at Home model which authorizes transitioning from a stay at home model and directed CDPHE to issue a public health order consistent with the directives of Executive Order 2020 044.

Effective April 27, 2020, CDPHE issued Public Order 20-28 (subsequently amended), which implemented a Safer at Home model. Safer at Home still requires that Vulnerable Individuals remain at home, but allows limited reopening of postsecondary institutions and certain businesses. Additionally, individuals are encouraged to stay at home as much as possible and practice Social Distancing to reduce the likelihood of disease transmission, but certain activities, such as gathering in groups of no more than ten for activities, are permitted. As we continue to combat COVID-19 in our communities, continuing restrictions on individual travel and necessary activities remain appropriate. PHO 20-28 recommends that people travel no more than 10 miles for recreation purposes.

5. **Legal Authority.** This Order is adopted pursuant to the legal authority set forth C.R.S. §§25-1-506(3), 508(5) and 509, as well as all other applicable laws, rules, regulations, orders and declarations. Under this authority, the Board has the power and duty to investigate and control the causes of epidemic or communicable diseases and conditions affecting public health; to establish, maintain, and enforce isolation and quarantine; to exercise physical control over the property and over persons of people within the territorial limits of Clear Creek County; to close public places and to prohibit gatherings of people to protect public health; all as the Clear Creek County Board of Health may find necessary for the protection of the public health. Immediate issuance of this Order is deemed reasonable and necessary under the existing circumstances and



necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of Clear Creek County, its citizens and the general public.

In addition, the Sheriff has a duty to “Make use of the search and rescue capability and resources available within the County and request assistance from the office of emergency management only when and if the sheriff determines such additional assistance is required” (C.R.S. §24-33.5-707(10)); and the Sheriff must maintain his ability to coordinate fire suppression efforts in the forest and wildlands (C.R.S. §30-10-513(1)).

6. **Most Restrictive Standards Control.** To the extent any State of Colorado and/or Federal orders or laws are more restrictive than what is set forth herein, such orders and laws control. Individuals should be aware that new orders from Governor Polis and the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (“CDPHE”) have been and continue to be issued on matters related to the COVID-19 pandemic. All members of the public are responsible for following the Governor’s and CDPHE’s orders and local orders including this Order. Additionally, Clear Creek County Board of Health may legally require and implement more restrictive standards, requirements, and orders for Clear Creek County than what the State of Colorado or the Federal government may require. To the extent this Order is more restrictive than orders from the State of Colorado or Federal government, this Order controls.

7. **Reasons for Road Closures.** Clear Creek County roads form a network providing local residents of Clear Creek County necessary access to their homes and neighborhoods. Clear Creek County has been experiencing large numbers of non-resident visitors traveling to, parking on, and gathering at, on and around these roads for the apparent purpose of accessing recreation lands. Parking on these roads and surrounding areas is not lawful under Ordinance No. 14 and also creates dangerous traffic and health conditions and represents a danger and nuisance to local residents. The use of ATVs is not lawful on County roads pursuant to CRS §33-14.5-110. Spring thaw has not fully opened roads, especially in the higher altitudes of many recreation areas and parking frequently is limited to parking on the roads.

The Clear Creek County Sheriff’s Office does not have the capacity and resources to adequately control, manage, police, and ensure the safety of these non-residents and their impacts on Clear Creek County and its residents, including preventing non-residents from gathering, disregarding social distancing requirements, and violating travel restrictions in violation of Governor Polis’s Executive Order No. D 2020-017 044 (“Safer At Home”) and CDPHE Public Health Order No. 20-28 (“PHO 20-28” as amended) implementing it.

Nor do Clear Creek County public safety personnel have the capacity to provide services to persons needing assistance on recreation lands, or to do so safely without putting the personnel at risk to the virus. An out-of-County resident’s rescue at St. Mary’s Glacier on April 3, 2020, required a team of about 20 responders. Since the original order was issued, Alpine Search and Rescue has not had to respond to recreational lands accessed by County roads. With the road closure in place, Alpine SAR has been called out 4 times (only once recreational lands, accessed by US highway) during the period April 11-May 12 (when the original order was in place) compared to an average of 10 times during the same period the four preceding years; the closure may have helped reduce the need for SAR.



The number of non-residents parking and gathering on and around these roads and using the adjacent public lands in Clear Creek County also increases the risk of spreading the COVID-19 virus. This Order is intended to prevent the spread of COVID-19 from non-residents entering or leaving Clear Creek County and ensure the health, safety and welfare of Clear Creek County residents and public safety personnel, and the general public. The Sheriff's Office gave notices of violating the original road closure order as follows: week ending April 20 (143 notices); week ending April 27 (450 notices); week ending May 4 (416 notices); week ending May 11 (136 notices). The week ending April 20 had adverse weather. The most notices were given during the effective period of the Stay-At-Home order (PHO 20-24, ending April 27). The reduction in notices the week ending May 11 may partly be attributable to one fewer deputy on duty but suggests the order is being effective. During the same period, traffic (measured at Veterans Memorial Tunnel, trucks excluded) on I-70 increased during the same period from 11,814 cars per day to 21,390 cars per day (3-day weekends).

Because Clear Creek County only began testing April 23, there is great uncertainty what the status of the spread of the virus is in the County. The basis for transitioning to "normal" is adequate testing and the capacity to do contact tracing.

The Public & Environmental Health Director and the Clear Creek County Sheriff, who are the responsible officers for public health and public safety responses most affected and who constitute the Unified Command managing this emergency disaster incident, recommend adoption of this amended order.

8. **Road Closures.** The use of road blocks, traffic control devices, signs, and other measures shall be taken to restrict access to Clear Creek County roads by non-residents except for **Necessary Travel**, including travel to/from work for **Critical Businesses**, and to perform **Critical Government Functions** (as the terms in bold are defined in CDPHE Order 20-24, as it may be amended), and travel to **Non-Critical Retail** and **Office-Based Businesses** and **Personal Services** to work, supply or keep an appointment with the businesses that are open for business, complying with PHO 20-28 and the state's guidance therefor, and do not involve recreating that exposes the nonresident to the potential need for emergency or search and rescue response, but excluding travel for the primary purpose of recreation. (The terms in bold are defined in CDPHE Order 20-28, as it may be amended.) The Clear Creek County's Sheriff's Office and Road & Bridge Department shall take such actions as deemed necessary for this purpose. The Clear Creek County Sheriff's Office also has the authority and is authorized to require persons seeking access to Clear Creek County roads to provide proof of Clear Creek County residency, or proof of eligibility under the terms of this order to use County roads, to Sheriff's Office or other County personnel regulating access to these roads. A valid Colorado driver's license that includes a Clear Creek County address is sufficient proof of Clear Creek County residency. The Clear Creek County Board of Health also may require the Sheriff's Office implement a permit sticker system allowing or requiring Clear Creek County residents obtain a sticker to be placed prominently on their vehicles identifying them as residents.

9. **General Information for all Persons.** The Board of Health strongly recommends that everyone within Clear Creek County comply with the Governor's Safer-at-Home order and Public Health Order 20-28 recommendations by confining their recreation to within 10 miles of



their own neighborhoods, limiting travel to **Necessary Travel**, and practicing **Social Distancing Requirements**.

Residents of Clear Creek County who use recreation lands are strongly encouraged to use recreation lands in a manner that does not expose them to the risk of requiring assistance from public safety personnel, who may not respond to calls for assistance at all or in a timely fashion.

Residents of Clear Creek County who are at heightened risk from COVID-19 are strongly encouraged to stay at home.

These actions are some of the most available and effective tools to help slow the spread of the virus in our community - and, importantly, to reduce the number of potential deaths caused by COVID-19. By slowing the spread, we have a chance to protect our family, friends, and neighbors who are at risk for severe illness. In particular, this includes all adults over age 60 and anyone with an underlying health condition.

These actions will limit the cascading impacts on critical services due to high absenteeism if large numbers of workers become ill. This Order and actions will help first responders and other public safety and health care services continue to provide services for those who need them in the coming weeks and months. Collective action can save lives and is in support of the most vulnerable in our community. The more united we can be in preventing the spread the greater the benefit for the whole community.

10. **Penalties.** Failure to comply with this Order is subject to the penalties contained in Sections 25-1-516 and 18-1.3-501, Colorado Revised Statutes, including a fine of up to five thousand (\$5,000) dollars and imprisonment in the county jail for up to eighteen (18) months.





