

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE
OPERATION OF SNOWMOBILES ON CLEAR CREEK COUNTY
ROADS #275, SILVER CREEK ROAD AND HARRIS DRIVE

WHEREAS, the Clear Creek Board of County Commissioners is authorized by 33-14-110(3)(f) to enact a resolution establishing snowmobile routes and to permit the operation of snowmobiles on county roads; and

WHEREAS, the Board deems this Resolution to be in the best interest of the citizens of Clear Creek County;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Clear Creek Board of County Commissioners that snowmobiles shall be permitted to operate on the following county roads:


1. Beginning at a point where County Road #275 intersects Pine Way and the southern boundary line of Unit 1, St. Mary's subdivision; thence north along County Road #275 to the point of intersection with Lake Road, which is the approximate point of entry for the St. Mary's Glacier Ski Area on the west side of County Road #275;
2. That part of Silver Creek Road from the point of intersection of Silver Creek Road and County Road #275 to the point of intersection of Silver Creek Road and Texas Drive; and
3. That part of Harris Drive from the point of intersection of Harris Drive and Texas Drive to the point of intersection of Harris Drive and Alice Road.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that such use shall be subject to the following rules and regulations:

1. Snowmobile Operation: All snowmobiles shall be operated in accordance with all applicable federal, state and local motor vehicle and snowmobile laws; in particular, but not exclusively, Section 33-14-101 et seq., C.R.S., and Titles 16, 25 and 42 of the Colorado Revised Statutes.
2. Application: These Regulations shall apply exclusively to snowmobiles and shall not apply to any other motorized vehicles or other all-terrain vehicles.
3. Roads: The roads described above shall be open for use by snowmobiles, but such use shall not be exclusive. All snowmobiles shall be used only upon the roads described above, marked for such use.
4. Safety Warning Flag: All snowmobiles shall carry a designated orange warning flag attached to a flexible pole affixed to the back of each snowmobile.
5. Signs: All snowmobiles shall be operated in accordance with all snowmobile signs; in addition to any other traffic signs appearing on the designated snowmobile route.
6. Driving: All snowmobiles shall be driven as far to the right shoulder of the road as possible; and shall be driven in single file.
7. Speed Limit: The speed limit for snowmobiles shall be that speed limit governing other motor vehicles, unless otherwise posted.


8. Yield: All snowmobiles shall yield the right-of-way to all other traffic but shall otherwise be operated in accordance with all federal, state and local motor vehicle laws, unless specifically stated otherwise herein.
9. Lights: All snowmobiles shall be equipped with at least one lighted head lamp and one lighted tail lamp; each of a minimum candlepower as prescribed by law. All snowmobiles shall be equipped with a brakelight at all times.
10. Age Restriction: No person under the age of sixteen years may operate a snowmobile on the county roads designated above.
11. Hunting and Carrying Weapons: It is unlawful for any person to hunt any wildlife from a snowmobile, or to operate or ride on any snowmobile with any firearm or bow in his/her possession.
12. Towing: No toboggans, inner tubes or sleds which are not specifically designed by the manufacturer for use with snowmobiles shall be towed by a snowmobile. No non-rigid towing devices will be permitted behind snowmobiles. This section will not apply to the towing of disabled snowmobiles in compliance with Colorado law, or to the use of snowmobiles in emergency operations when authorized by the Clear Creek County Sheriff's Department.
13. Registration: All snowmobiles will be registered in accordance with Colorado law; and will display such Colorado registration number or the registration number of the state of origin or country.
14. Accident Reporting: The operator of any snowmobile involved in any accident resulting in death, bodily injury or property damage will comply with all state laws regarding accidents and accident reports; and shall immediately report any such accident to the Clear Creek County Sheriff's Department and the Colorado Division of Parks and Outdoor Recreation.
15. Permit Required: No snowmobile may be travel on the county roads described above without first obtaining a permit from Clear Creek County. There shall not be a fee for obtaining such a permit. Permits may be obtained at the office of the Clear Creek County Planning Department and at such other locations as designated by the Clear Creek Board of County Commissioners for the convenience of the public.
16. Offenses and Penalties: All operations and use of snowmobiles are subject to state law regarding offenses and penalties.
